Family Engagement

Imagine waking up to a phone call in the middle of the night and by morning you've added two new siblings to your family for an indeterminate period of time.

The kids show up sleepy-eyed, traumatized and heartbroken. You've got to help them settle in, find daycare or school and set two more places at the dinner table, all while learning to walk alongside them through their emotional, and sometimes physical, pain.

That's a challenging, "Yes."

One of the most valuable ways your investment in America's Kids Belong works is to increase awareness of the critical need for foster parents and the valuable impact they can make in the life of a child.

We begin by engaging child-welfare agencies at the state and/or county level, seeking to understand their needs and partner to find creative ways to lend support. In many cases this involves raising awareness of the foster care crisis and the need for more foster parents.

The *I Belong Project* hosts fun and therapeutic video shoots where creative videos and professional photography give a face and voice to harder-to-place children in foster care. These youth are legally free to be adopted.

America's Kids Belong partners with Departments of Children's Services / Social Services to amplify the kids' voices, stories and dreams of a forever family.

Last year we produced 512 amazing stories that contributed to 310 children being placed in permanent, adoptive homes.

These videos ripple across the thousands of people who view their heartwarming stories each year. Some donate or volunteer, others feel inspired to explore fostering and still others engage their churches and businesses to become foster friendly.

Community Engagement

Kinship and foster families are the first responders who show up in the midst of crisis to stand in the gap for a hurting, vulnerable child or sibling group.

Each step of the way kinship and foster families embrace the role of healer – of hearts, bodies and minds. Sadly, nearly half stop fostering within the first year, often citing *a lack of community* and social support.

We partner with business, civic and faith organizations to build foster friendly communities where kinship and foster families receive the encouragement, support and resources they need to thrive.

Foster Friendly App

Our Foster Friendly App connects families with exclusive discounts and services.

Last year your support enabled nearly 2,500 foster and kinship families to take advantage of everything from a weeknight discount on dinner to restorative self-care services for weary foster moms.

Foster friendly faith communities provide trauma training to their care givers to ensure their communities are safe and welcoming. They preach about foster care and encourage members to consider fostering, and they host programs like Kinship/Foster Parents' Night Out to give families a safe respite.

Collective Impact

Building foster friendly communities, where government, business, faith and civic communities bring their strengths and influence together to improve the experience and outcomes of kids in foster care, creates a powerful collective impact on the well-being and strength of the community as a whole.

Last year we helped launch three governors' campaigns in South Dakota, Tennessee, and Utah. When governors move foster care high on their agendas it helps marshal the attention, resources and support needed to drive change. Hard-working child-welfare professionals engage with America's Kids Belong and enable us to:

- · Assist in recruiting more foster parents.
- Support families with foster friendly civic and faith communities to offer a safe haven for foster parents.
- Invite businesses to participate in the Foster Friendly App and lend additional support as business impact partners.

As awareness grows, more people say yes to fostering, while still others say yes to showing up for these kids and their families. Soon an entire community is saying yes to the importance of standing in the gap for kids in need, knowing that in helping these kids reach their full potential they're also creating a stronger community for us all.





LETTER FROM THE CEO

2022 FOCUS AREAS

To the friends of America's Kids Belong,

Thank you for all that you did in 2021 to help us improve the experience and outcomes for kids in foster care across America.

In my first full year as CEO I've broadened my perspective on the need and urgency of our mission; a perspective that started with my own family's life-changing story – the story of fostering and adopting five-year-old "Bubba." Over the past year, I've gained a broader, national perspective on 400,000 stories like Bubba's that are repeated in counties and states across our country every day.

Many individuals and organizations are committed to addressing the foster-care crisis across three stages:

Prevention

The top priority always is to provide the resources and support families need to offer children a safe, healthy environment, and avoid the pain and trauma of separation. Kinship placement can be a helpful way to sustain family ties.

Foster Care and Adoption

When those options are not available, foster care is an opportunity for temporary, caring parents to stand in the gap with a child (or sibling group) until the family can heal and reunify.
Unfortunately of the 400,000 kids in foster care, more than 100,000 kids, 25 percent, are in need of permanent adoptive families.

Transition

At 18 kids legally are considered adults and "age out" of foster care. Without support these young people are at much greater risk for homelessness, addiction, justice-involvement, under-employment, under-education, and other obstacles to achieving their full potential.

As America's Kids Belong grows and seeks to scale our impact, we've also continually challenged our strategic focus and where we are best positioned for impact. We believe we are uniquely equipped to unite government, business and faith organizations to create a powerful collective impact on foster care and adoption.

Foster Friendly

Our foster friendly movement recognizes that foster parents are the "first responders," showing up in that moment of crisis to provide urgently needed shelter and support. But just like other emergency situations, it takes a team to ensure the best outcomes long-term.

Our Foster Friendly App is a ground-breaking, innovative tool for connecting foster parents to their communities, offering access to a broad range of discounts, services and foster friendly resources in their neighborhoods and communities. Our goal is to rapidly scale the scope and number of resources available nationwide.

In May we will launch our first foster friendly community campaign to build awareness in participating states and counties that we all have a stake in ensuring our kids in foster care thrive. We believe this is the seed to a national movement that will grow in reach and impact year over year.

The metrics detailed in this report offer a quick snapshot of how we are stewarding your investment for maximum impact. I invite you to consider how to increase your investment this year as we advance our foster friendly movement until:




